A Note from the Superintendent ...

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to feel this way about you all, because I hold you in my heart, for you are all partakers with me of grace...and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. (Philippians 1:2-7)

These words of Saint Paul to the Church in Philippi are amongst my most favorite in all of the great Apostle's correspondence in the New Testament. Christian Education Committing to Renewal

“I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.” (Romans 12:1-2)

The end of summer brings with it many changes. Summer activities end and a new season begins. Teachers, parents and children alike enter into a time of both relief and anxious anticipation of what the coming school year might bring, and we all await the arrival of cooler weather and the beauty of changed leaves as Fall begins. True Christian renewal is a process that cannot and should not begin and end on Sunday mornings.** If we are to impact the children in our care for Christ as we are all called to do it is imperative that the Gospel be central to

all we do, whether at home or at church. Thus the commitment to full family involvement in all aspects of our Christian Education program here is something we will continue to stress this year.

With this always on the forefront we will also be offering other opportunities for family involvement in the life and work of the church, including a Christmas Pageant this year. Stay tuned for more on this as the season approaches. As always, if you have any questions or concerns as we go forward please don't hesitate to ask either myself or one of our teachers.

On more personal note, if I haven't had the opportunity to meet any of you personally yet, I hope to do so in the coming weeks. Thank you again for making me feel so welcome here. To say that my time here thus far has been a blessing is a bit of an understatement.

Caregiver Stress

*“Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace,
that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help
in time of need.” (Hebrews 4:16)*

Caregiving is a tough job. Caregiving often takes a great deal of time, effort, and work. Many caregivers struggle to balance caregiving with other responsibilities including full-time jobs and caring for children and grandchildren. Being a caregiver is demanding, both physically and emotionally. Too often, caregivers give so much that they shortchange themselves. They may become overwhelmed and isolated, and their health may suffer, as does their ability to give care. If you are a caregiver you need and deserve support so you can safeguard your own health while providing the care your loved one requires.

Caregiving stress is a daily fact of life for many caregivers. Caregiver stress is the emotional and physical strain of caregiving. Constant stress can lead to “burnout” and health problems for the caregiver. Caregivers may feel guilty, frustrated, and angry from time to time. For instance, you may feel: frustrated and angry taking care of someone with dementia who often wanders away or becomes easily upset; guilty because you think that you should be able to provide better care, despite all the other things that you have to do; lonely because all the time you spend caregiving has hurt your social life; and exhausted when you go to bed at night. Other symptoms of caregiver stress include anxiety, depression, sleeplessness, irritability, lack of concentration, and health problems.

Jesus said, *“come to me, all of you who are tired from carrying heavy loads and I will give you rest”* (Matthew 11:28). As you devote yourselves to the care of a loved one remember it is important to learn and practice strategies to reduce your stress and prevent burnout.

Tips to reduce caregiver stress:

First, learn as much as possible about your loved one’s illness. Learn how to be a caregiver. Knowledge will help you be a better caregiver, and you will feel better about your efforts.

Second, know your limits and be realistic. You can only give so much of your time and yourself. Set limits and share them with your family members, the doctors, and others.

Third, accept your feelings. Caregiving can trigger a host of difficult emotions, including anger, fear, resentment, guilt, helplessness, and grief. As long as you don't compromise the well-being of the care receiver, allow yourself to feel what you feel.

Fourth, confide in others. Don't allow your emotions to bottle up. Talk to people, whether they are family members, friends, your doctor, or maybe a therapist or counselor. Don't be afraid to turn to a close friend or family member. They can provide you with much-needed support on many levels. And don't overlook your church family—they can provide the practical, emotional, and spiritual support you need. Caregivers need to know they are not alone, even if it sometimes feels that way. If you are serving as your loved one's caregiver, a caregivers' support group can offer emotional support.

A Caregivers' Support Group will start up on September 20th (Monday) at 7:00 p.m. at the Church of The Apostles and meet on the third Monday of each month. I will be the facilitator of this support group. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.


May we choose righteousness my beloved brothers and sisters. Sing Alleluia! To Jesus our Lord. Amen.

Study Opportunities ...

An Overview of the Old Testament

On Thursdays September 23rd and 30th, from 7:00 p.m. to 8:15 p.m., there will be teaching on the general timeline of the Old Testament and on learning to read the Old Testament books.

On September 23rd we will look at the history of Israel and God's revelation to his people. Knowing the general history of Israel is helpful when reading a book of the Old Testament and trying to understand it's focus and context.

On September 30th we will look at the books of the Old Testament. In knowing where the books fit into the history of Israel we can become more aware of what the books are saying. We will also look at the different types of Old Testament literature. A book of history is read differently than a book of wisdom or poetry.

As I came to understand the timeline, how God speaks to His people and the different types of literature in the Old Testament, God's Word opened up to me in a way it never had before. My prayer is that I can share that understanding God has so graciously given me. I will try to answer any questions that you may have on September 30th. — *Elder Nina Deuel*


