What is the main theme of this letter?


Key Theme:



Family Relationships

Screwtape: Build "Domestic Hatred"

- Turn off: thoughts of charity, humility, forgiveness
- Focus on: Interpersonal grievances, habits of "mutual annoyance" and passive-aggressive "warfare"
- Turn off: True Spiritual self-reflection
- Encourage: Spiritual and Relational Hypocrisy.







Taking Aim Against Relationships:

What is the function of family relationships in Christ?

Destroying our closest relationships ruins our daily opportunities for: learning humility, learning self-control, learning to serve others, practicing the fruits of the spirit.

But most importantly, it destroys our witness for Christ:

"Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in Love"


How do we learn to "bear with one another"?

Three aspects...



First: Recognize our own sinfulness

1 Peter 2:4-5 "If someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore him gently. But, watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted."



Matthew 7:3-4 "How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye', when there is a log in your own eye? You hypocrite! First take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye."



Second: Pay attention to our Speech

Proverbs 15:1 "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."


Ephesians 4:29 "Don't use foul or abusive language, let everything you say be good and helpful, so that your words will be an encouragement to those who hear them"

We Pray...

"Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us."

In other words...

"Do NOT forgive us our trespasses, as we have NOT forgiven those who trespass against us."



Third: Prioritize Forgiveness

Colossians 3:12-13

"Clothe yourself in compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if anyone has a grievance against someone.

Forgive as the LORD forgave you."

Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ forgave you."
